



Se usa el presente continuo para hablar de una acción que está sucediendo justo en ese momento. Para formar el presente continuo se usa *to be + el verbo + ing*. **Ing** corresponde a las terminaciones ‘ando’ / ‘iendo’ en español. Así que – ‘eating’ significa ‘comiendo.’ Un ejemplo de una frase en el presente continuo es...

I'm playing and I'm singing.

Estoy jugando y estoy cantando.



She's singing.

Excepciones

Aunque estamos hablando de algo que está sucediendo en este momento, hay unos verbos que generalmente no admiten el presente continuo. Normalmente son verbos relacionados con estados de mente.

I want a beer ✓ I'm wanting a beer ✗



She's playing tennis.

El presente continuo tiene dos usos

- Literalmente en el momento de hablar: *I am walking down the street: Estoy caminando por la calle.*
- En esta época de tu vida: *At the moment, I'm working at Vodafone: Actualmente estoy trabajando en Vodafone.*

Problemas

El problema para el hablante de español es que en su idioma se puede usar la forma de presente simple y presente continuo para hablar del momento. Por ejemplo: *¿Qué haces?- o- ¿Qué estás haciendo?* Los dos pueden significar: *What are you doing?'*

En inglés esto no es posible. La única forma que se puede emplear para describir una acción que está sucediendo en ese momento es el ‘Present continuous’.

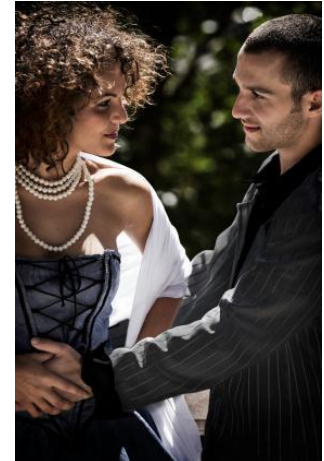

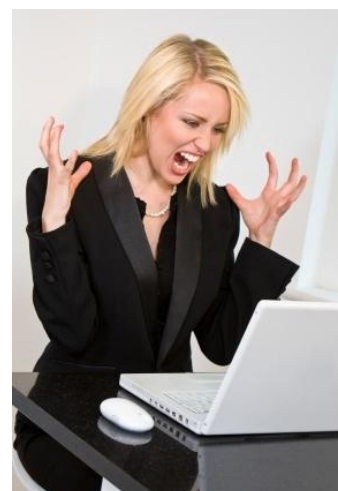

Problemas

En inglés se usan formas distintas del futuro: *I'll call you later... I'm working next week.* (Este tema está tratado en la unidad *Future*.)
3. En castellano se puede usar el presente para hacer sugerencias: *¿Abro la ventana?....* Esto no es posible en inglés. En inglés se usa *shall*. *Shall I open the window?*
